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

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All entries will be done by photography/digital image and must be submitted electronically at the NBEX.ca website. Entries will be accepted between 9 am Thursday, August 20th and midnight, Monday, August 31st. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. Directions for posting are as follows: Fill in Entry Form Link found on NBEX.ca website and use attachment to add photos/digital images. Make sure all information for each item you are submitting is filled out.
- 2. **One entry per exhibitor per class**, unless otherwise specified. The work must have been done by the entrant and finished within the last year. The age of anyone 18 or younger should be marked on their entry form.
- 3. **A separate entry form** needs to be used for each individual person entering items.
- 4. **Please note special requirements** for certain items in each section.
- 5. **Please note there is no specified "Senior" section.** All items of those 19 and older will be judged together.
- 6. **Keep in mind the appearance of the item in your photos/images.** Things should be arranged neatly and in accordance with the specified instructions.
- 7. **There are no monetary prizes this year**, but ribbons will be sent to you if your submissions are judged to be winners. Ribbons will only be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.
- 8. **Keep in mind that these rules and regulations are for the 2020 Virtual NBEX only.** Due to the constraints placed upon us by the Covid-19 Global Pandemic, many changes have been made in comparison to years past. We apologize for any exclusions or eliminations as we had to do the best we could during these unprecedented times. We look forward to the return of our regular Fair's policies and procedures when the Government of NB and its Public Officials deem it is safe to do so.
- 9. **Winners will be announced online on September 6th, 2020**. Ribbons will be mailed out the following week.

DIVISION V - FIELD & GARDEN CROPS

Division 5 - Sections 1, 2, 3, 3B, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 are Field and Garden Crops

- 1. Products must have been produced this year.
- 2. Products exhibited must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 3. An exhibitor may enter only one exhibit in any individual class.
- 4. Any products exhibited in pairs or bunches must be firmly attached.

Suggestions on How to Prepare a Good Vegetable Exhibit

- 1. Correct number of articles per entry count carefully.
- 2. For freshness vegetable should not be picked and prepared too far ahead of time.
- 3. All exhibits should be free of disease, blemishes, insect injury, and excessive dirt
- 4. Exhibits should not be washed gentle rubbing with a soft cloth will remove most of the soil.
- 5. Onions should not be peeled only jagged and dirty outer scales should be removed.
- 6. Root vegetables should have tops removed 1/2 cm. above the crown.
- 7. Corn should be shown with 1/3 of the husk removed.

RULES FOR FLOWERS ENTRANTS

- 1. Exhibitors are not allowed to exhibit more than one entry in each class.
- 2. Correct number of stems, head, spikes or blooms.
- 3. Large size of petals, blooms, florets.
- 4. Good condition fresh, bright blooms and foliage.
- 5. Well exhibited in glass or ceramic containers not crowded, stems hold blooms erect.
- 6. No fading, wilting, spots or insect injury.
- 7. Carefully disbud cosmos, petunia, etc. as buds open quickly and disqualify entry because of too many blooms.
- 8. One plant per pot, unless specified otherwise.
- 9. Flowers in Section 1 should be uniform in size and maturity.
